About the Children of the Republic of Texas

History

March 1, 1929, during The Daughters of the Republic of Texas Convention, a motion was made and passed that the DRT sponsor a junior organization known as the "Children of the Republic of Texas." The first CRT Chapter organized was Alamo Mission in San Antonio, with 34 members.

Objectives

- To encourage the study of Texas History
- To help preserve the places made sacred by the men and women who achieved Texas
 Independence
- To stimulate historical research into the earliest records of Texas
- To foster the preservations of documents and relics
- To revere the Flag of Texas and to promote the display of same
- To cherish and preserve TEXAS, ONE AND INDIVISIBLE, as achieved by the Fathers and Mothers of the Texas Revolution



Flag

The CRT flag was designed and adopted June 1994 at the annual convention by the BOM. CRT President General, David Foster conducted the CRT Official Flag Contest. Custodian General 2006-2007, Reed Denton conducted a fundraiser as his officer's general project and had the flag commissioned. Shown is the smaller version, the larger version is bound by red fringe.

TEXAS HONOR DAYS

September 18 Texas Heroes Day

The date of September 18 has multiple significant factors in that on September 18, 1842; thirty-six volunteer Texan soldiers were killed on the field of battle in the Dawson Massacre. Of the survivors, three escaped to tell the story, and fifteen others were taken prisoner by Mexican soldiers in the Woll invasion near Salado Creek (where Fort Sam Houston is now located in San Antonio). The captured prisoners were marched away to Perote Castle Prison in Veracruz, Mexico. Of these men, only nine survived to return to Texas. The remains of one captive who died were thrown into the castle moat. September 18, 1848, the remains of fifty-two men who died in Perote Prison, including sixteen of the seventeen who survived the Mier Expedition, were imprisoned at Perote Prison, and drew the "Black Beans of Death" on March 25, 1843, to decide who would be executed, were buried at what became known as Monument Hill at LaGrange.

Texian Navy Day

Texian Navy Day honors the courage and determination of the small Texian Navy who, by 1842 had helped secure the Gulf of Mexico and protect Texas independence on the sea. It also pays tribute to the 1832 Battle of Velasco, when Texian volunteers on sea and on land fought an early skirmish for their rights. (Celebrated on the 3rd Saturday of September).

October 2 Gonzales Day

Gonzales Day is in remembrance of the first skirmish fought in the Texas War for Independence. On October 2, 1835, the citizens of Gonzales refused to give up a small cannon to the Mexican Military. Texians rallied around a flag showing a cannon and a single black star, with the legend "Come and Take It!" The Mexican troops retreated to San Antonio. The Texians, under Stephen F. Austin organized an army and followed. Gonzales is remembered as "The Lexington of Texas."

November 3, 1793 Stephen F. Austin's Birthday

Honoring "The Father of Texas", who brought the first 300 Anglo families into Texas beginning in 1822 and who helped guide Texas during the difficult years under the Mexican flag. Austin served as the first commander of the Texas Army during the War for Texas Independence and later served as a commissioner to the United States. He was also the first to hold office as Secretary of State of the Texian Republic. Austin died in December of 1836 and is now buried in the State Cemetery in Austin, Texas.

November 6 1891 DRT Founder's Day

DRT Founder's Day honors the 1891 chartering of The Daughters of the Republic of Texas at "The Cradle" in Galveston. The surviving members of the Texas Veterans Association passed the legacy of the Texan Republic to the DRT who vowed to keep the memory and spirit of early Texas alive for generations to come.

December 9 Siege of Béxar Day

The Siege of Béxar began in October of 1835 and ended with the surrender of Mexican General Cos on December 9, 1835. This was the only Victory of the Texas Revolution until the Battle of San Jacinto.

January 26 Mirabeau B. Lamar Day

Lamar, second president of the Texas Republic, advocated setting aside land for public schools. This resulted in the Texas Congress establishing a system of public education. During Lamar's term as president, the city of Austin was created and made the state capital. Lamar also approved the design of the state flag and seal. He is known as the "Father of Education." Lamar University in Beaumont is named in his honor.

February 19 Texas Statehood Day

Statehood Day honors Texas' entry into the United States as the 28th state of the Union. Following a vote of the Texan people to annex themselves to the United States, President John Tyler admitted Texas into the 16

Union in December 1845. The actual change of government from independent nation to state came on February 19, 1846 when Texas President Anson Jones lowered the Texas flag at the state capitol and the United States flag was raised in its place.

March 1 CRT Founder's Day

CRT Founder's Day honors the 1929 chartering of the Children of the Republic of Texas. The Daughters of the Republic of Texas sponsor the organization to be known as the Children of the Republic of Texas, such members to be subject to the Bylaws of our organization pertaining to membership and objectives and that a committee be appointed to further the same.

March 2 Texas Independence and Flag Day

This day honors the signing of the Texas Declaration of Independence at Washington-on-the Brazos. As Colonel William B. Travis and the brave defenders of the Alamo withstood Santa Anna's army, the fifty-nine delegates representing each of the Texas colonies and municipalities gathered in Convention and declared Texas an independent nation. An ad-interim government was elected with David G. Burnet as President and Lorenzo de Zavala as Vice-President. A Constitution was adopted on March 17, 1836.

March 6 Alamo Heroes Day

Alamo Heroes Day honors the heroic sacrifices of the less than 200 Texian citizen-soldiers who defended the Alamo from February 23 – March 6, 1836. Electing to fight to the death rather than surrender, they gave their lives in order that Texas might live, and their sacrifice was not in vain. The battle cry "Remember the Alamo!" became the rallying point for the Texian people and continues to inspire Texans and Americans. The Alamo has become an international symbol of courage, honor, and the love of liberty and is visited by over 3 million people each year.

March 27 Goliad Heroes Day

Goliad Day honors those who gave their lives in the cause of Texas Independence at Goliad. Following the fall of the Alamo, part of Santa Anna's army attacked Col. Fannin's troops at Goliad. Fannin was forced to surrender after the battle of Coleto Creek on March 19-20, 1836. He and his men were promised fair treatment and parole, but Santa Anna ordered that all prisoners be shot. On March 27, over 320 unknowing Texian prisoners were marched out and executed. This was the largest loss of life in the battle for Texas Independence. "Remember Goliad" became one of the great battle cries at San Jacinto. When we remember Goliad, we also remember those who gave their lives at Refugio, Coleto Creek, and San Patricio, as well as Pachita Alavez, "The Angel of Goliad," who helped save several of the Texian prisoners from being shot.

April 21, San Jacinto Day

San Jacinto Day honors the victory of the Texian Army over Santa Anna. On April 21, 1836, forty-six days after the fall of the Alamo, Sam Houston led less than 1000 Texians against the Mexican Army. With the battle cries of "Remember the Alamo" and "Remember Goliad" ringing in their ears, Texian troops took less than 20 minutes to defeat more than 1600 Mexican soldiers. Santa Anna was captured and promised to remove his army from Texas. This secured the independence of the Texian people who went on to build a great Republic and state.

May 14, Treaty of Valasco Day

May 14, 1836, the day the Treaties of Velasco were signed between General Santa Anna and Republic of Texas Interim President David G. Burnet. In the public treaty, the Mexican ruler promised to never again fight against the Texans. He also agreed to order all Mexican forces out of Texas immediately. In the secret treaty, in return for his freedom, Santa Anna agreed to work for Mexican recognition of Texas independence. It called for the Texas government to release Santa Anna immediately and give him an escort back to Mexico. In return, Santa Anna would also agree to work inside Mexico to get the Texas boundary set at the Rio Grande. For more information visit www.drtinfo.org

Voting

Who is eligible to vote?

- 1. All CRT Members who are 10 years or older
- 2. Present at the CRT state convention
- 3. Voting members are identified and will have designated seating during the business meeting of the Annual Convention.

What do you vote about?

Voting activity may include items presented from the CRT Board of Management. An example may be a bylaw change.

How do you debate?

The information will be read to the assembly and/or handouts may be made available. As appropriate, questions should be asked by addressing the officer in charge from the floor. Usually, the President General will recognize an individual. Follow parliamentary procedures by being recognized.

Example: identify yourself by your name and chapter and then state your question.

How do you vote?

Wait for the President General's instructions on how to vote. It could be a standing vote, a ballot vote or via voce (meaning by voice)

Election of the Board of Management

- 1. The Nominating Committee Chairman will present the recommended slate of officers.
- 2. A candidate may be nominated from the floor. If there is more than one candidate for an office, each candidate or their representative will be allowed two (2) minutes to speak on their behalf.
- 3. When more than one candidate is nominated, a written ballot is cast by each voting member.
- 4. Adult tellers will distribute the ballots, then collect, count and report the results.
- 5. If only one candidate is presented, they will be elected by acclamation.

NATIONAL NOMINATING COMMITTEE

- 1. One voting aged member from each chapter, present at the state convention on Friday, will serve as a member of the state nominating committee. During the meeting, the committee will recommend a slate of officers for the upcoming term.
- 2. The candidates must complete the Officers General Nomination Packet. The forms are available in the CRT Annual Project Book and online at www.crttexas.com.

- 3. When a chapter's member attends the nominating committee meeting, they will have the application to review for each office a candidate has recommended.
- 4. The nominating committee will recommend the candidate they feel is best qualified for the office.
- 5. The nominating committee will be able to discuss all candidates who have applied for an office to determine which person is best qualified.
- 6. The nominating committee's recommendations are by vote with the majority selecting the candidate. If there is only one candidate for an office, that person can be selected; however, the nominating committee will make the final choice.
- 7. Candidates may select more than one office. The nominating committee may recommend the candidate for a second or third choice on the application.
- 8. The CRT State Director will serve as an advisor and may select an adult to assist as secretary for the group. No other adults are allowed so members have the opportunity to participate in a democratic process through this leadership opportunity.

- ❖ All motions of CRT, whether they are made during the annual business meeting, nominating committee, or a Board of Management Meeting, shall be made in writing on the official CRT Motion Form. The maker of the motion may use an electronic submission and the form may be found on the DRT and CRT websites.
- ❖ Any motion not coming from a committee chairman must have a maker, a second, signature and date (two members of one chapter may make a motion). Motion forms shall be made available during the annual business meeting from the CRT Parliamentarian or DRT 3rd VP/CRT Director.
- ❖ The use of the formal CRT Motion form is encouraged for all chapters.
- ❖ The motion form can be found in the current Manual of Procedure (MOP) on the CRT Website at www.crttexas.com.



Annual CRT Awards

Edward Philmore Haltom, Jr. Trophy

This award was begun in 1986 in memory of Edward Philmore Haltom Jr., a past President General of the CRT. This trophy is to be presented annually to the CRT Chapter that is judged to have had the best program or project during the past year. Applying chapter must submit an essay of 150 words minimum describing the program or project completed. Pictures are not required but are beneficial. A panel of unbiased judges will select the award winner.

James Milton Rash Memorial Trophy

The Rash Family is giving this trophy to the Children of the Republic of Texas in loving memory of James Milton Rash, CRT President General 1968-1969. Jim Rash was an avid researcher and genealogist during his adult life and often spoke to groups about genealogical research. The trophy is presented to a CRT member who is 14 years of age or older, researches and prepares an essay of 150-200 words, describing his Republic of Texas ancestor and the ancestor's contribution to the Republic. Papers will be judged on how the CRT member presents the facts, not on the accomplishments of the ancestor. A panel of unbiased judges will select the award winner.

Carolyn DeKeith Cook Roth Memorial Trophy

A gift of the John W. Roth family, this trophy will be presented annually to the CRT member judged to be the year's outstanding member. The trophy is presented to a candidate who is an active CRT member exhibiting scholarship and demonstrating involvement in religious activities, sports, and community affairs. The candidate's sponsoring DRT chapter should submit a report on the candidate, which is to include a list of CRT activities as well as the abovementioned qualities. A panel of unbiased judges will select the award winner.

Grandmother of the Year Award

This award will be presented during the annual CRT Convention to the grandmother selected to be the year's outstanding Grandmother. Nominating CRT members must submit a minimum 100- word essay(s) of their grandmother's contributions to CRT, chapter activities during the year, member's involvement, and other qualifications of your outstanding Grandmother. Nomination Form and essay(s) must be submitted to the CRT President General and the CRT Director. The CRT Board of Management will select the award winner. Nominees are eligible for this award every five years.
